1. Introductions were made and mission of the advising council was discussed. Each member is there to learn and help "spread the word" about good advising practices at Stockton.

3. Pat Donahue and Dana DeFiore gave an overview of the services provided by the Career Center. Career Fair is October 4. Be sure to show students Career Connect. There is now a link to faculty resources on the Career Connect website.

4. Paula gave an overview of the self-study and the information gained from doing it. The outside consultant, Dr. Jayne Drake, met with students, faculty and staff on September 27, 2012 and will give a report based on her interviews. Overall, the self-study points to students wanting a deeper relationship with faculty. The self-study also revealed that traffic in the Center for Academic Advising (CAA) office has increased dramatically (139%). The CAA is in the process of reviewing applications for an assistant director position.

5. Peter described the process of applying for the Provost's R&PD Award in Academic Advising. Proposals are now being accepted for the 2013 award. 6. Probation holds: those students below a 2.0 will be seeing an academic advisor to lift the hold and set goals for academic success. Discussion ensued about the new C.A.R.E. mentoring program which is off to a good start at Stockton. Details are on the C.A.R.E. program website.

These events are due to be recorded and placed on the Stockton YouTube channel.

8. Peter discussed that the double major work on CAPP would most likely begin this spring.

9. Peter also gave an overview of a grant on which he is principal investigator. The grant is for degree completion for students who left without completing their degree at Stockton. Exceptions for

completing courses at other institutions in order to complete requirements will be considered as each case is brought forward.

10. Paula discussed precepting tips: this meeting the tip was about taking courses at another institution. Please read carefully the policies and procedures surrounding whether a course can be taken at another institution. In particular, no work can be completed at another college when a "D" or "F" was made in a course.
