Pursuant to a Memorandum of Understanding entered into between the parties on September 2018 ("MOU"), the Department of Business Administration, National Chiayi University (hereinafter referred to as "NCYU") and the School of Business, Stockton University (hereinafter referred to as "Stockton University") agree to implement this Dual Degree Program Agreement ("Agreement"), aiming to cultivate international workforce, provide students with an educational opportunity and boost their competitiveness in the international workplace.

I. Admission

Students entering the dual degree program ("Program") must meet the admission requirements of both institutions. NCYU students must be current registered MBA's students for at least a semester; and Stockton University students must be selected and recommended by the School of Business.

II. Selection Process

A. Application Procedure

Applicants at each institution shall submit their application materials to the admission office at the home institution before the application deadline established by the home institution. The selection committee (as defined below) at each institution will select the qualified students and recommend them to the admission office at the host institution. The host institution will assess the applications and notify the home institution of the application results.

B. Selection committee

The selection committee at each institution shall consist of the chairperson of the dual degree program and/or department professors.

III. Articulated Curriculum and Terms of Degree Conferral

A. NCYU students must take at least 36 credits of courses and complete a thesis to be granted a Master's degree. The 36 credits include 6 credits of required courses, 24

- credits of elective courses, and 6 credits of thesis.
- B. Stockton University students must take at least 36 credits of courses to be granted a Master's degree. The 36 credits include 24 credits of required courses and 12 credits of elective courses.
 - C. The Articulated Curriculum is specified in the Articulation Agreement entered into between the parties.

IV. Credit Transfer and Acceptance

- A. Students shall meet the minimum course-hour requirements of each institution. In addition, the number of credit hours earned from each of the two institutions shall not be less than one-third of the total number of credit hours required for graduation.
- B. The upper limit of credit transfer is 9 to 15 credits. The list of course equivalents is specified in the Articulation Agreement.

V. Length of Study

The length of study at each institution will conform to such institution's general academic rules of graduate studies.

VI. Thesis Supervision (If necessary)

The supervision of thesis work will be resolved through the consultation between faculty members from both universities. The related details shall be described in the Joint Master Thesis Supervision Agreement to be entered into between the parties.

VII. Degree Conferral

Upon successfully completing the Program, participating students who meet graduation requirements for this Program will be conferred an accredited Master's degree from NCYU and an accredited Master's degree from Stockton University.

VIII. Administrative provisions

The administrative processes such as enrollment, application for suspension of study, and returning from suspension, shall conform to the current regulations of both institutions.

IX. Tuition, fees and quota

- A. Participants of this Program are responsible for paying tuition and fees to the host institution, and books and supplies, travel, meals, and room and board. Any other fees at the host institution are paid by participants of this Program.
- B. Participants of this Program are required to obtain or purchase health insurance in accordance with the requirements of the host institution.

C. Quota: maximum of 3 students each year, except that more may be admitted in the discretion of the chairperson of the admitting institution.


X. Effectiveness, Modification and Termination

This Agreement will be effective for a period of five years from the date of final signature and shall expire five (5) years thereafter. Either party at any time may terminate this Agreement with six (6) months advance written notice to the other party. Such termination will not adversely affect any students currently enrolled at any stage of the Program. Any amendments or renewals of this Agreement shall not be valid unless made in writing and signed by both parties.
