The Bachelor of Arts/Science in Marine Science at


THE RICHARD STOCKTON COLLEGE OF NEW JERSEY

The intent of the Agreement is to facilitate the smooth transfer and transition of community college graduates into appropriate upper level programs.

This Transfer Articulation Agreement is based upon the completion of an A.S. degree in Marine Science at Gloucester County College.

The terms of this Agreement apply to those Gloucester County College graduates as of Spring 2011 and those entering transferring to the Richard Stockton College of New Jersey beginning Fall 2011. Programmatic changes by either institution will necessitate amendments to this Agreement as appropriate.



The following conditions, equivalencies and recommendations have been identified by the two institutions participating in this Agreement.

I. A. Criteria for admission to the College and or the specific upper-level program:

Students graduating from the associate degree program at Gloucester County College, who meet current admission criteria, will be accepted into the baccalaureate Marine Science Program at Richard Stockton College. Prospective students must submit a standard application to Richard Stockton College and pay the required fees.

Students at Gloucester County College who are interested in articulating to Richard Stockton College may, upon request, consult a faculty preceptor from Richard Stockton College while still attending Gloucester County College. Upon matriculation the Gloucester County College student will be assigned a faculty preceptor.

A faculty exchange for guest lectures may take place between the faculties at Richard Stockton College and Gloucester County College. The exchange will be dependent upon faculty availability and interest.

B. Specific course or program criteria:

Gloucester County College students who graduated prior to the articulation agreement will be admitted to Richard Stockton College under the current admission process.

All degree programs at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey require a minimum total of 128 credits with a Stockton grade-point average of 2.00.

For the Bachelor of Science in Marine Science students must pass a minimum of 80 program/cognate credits taken at Gloucester County College and/or Richard Stockton College to receive a Bachelor of Science degree with a minimum grade-point average of 2.00 for courses taken at Stockton.

For the Bachelor of Arts in Marine Science students must pass a minimum of 64 program/cognate credits taken at Gloucester County College and/or Richard Stockton College to receive a Bachelor of Science degree with a minimum grade-point average of 2.00 for courses taken at Stockton.

Gloucester County College students will be required to complete approximately 24 credits in liberal arts courses at Richard Stockton. These credits include one General Integration and Synthesis (GIS) course and at least three additional General Studies courses. The remainder of the courses must be taken in areas unrelated to science.

All Richard Stockton students are required to meet the College's Writing, Quantitative Reasoning (Q), Arts (A), Historical Consciousness (H), Values/Ethics (V) , and International/Multicultural (I) requirements. Specifications for this requirement are noted in the Richard Stockton Bulletin and on the NJ Transfer Web site.

II. A maximum of 64 credits will be accepted from Gloucester County College. These 64 credits will be allocated by the successful completion of the following courses:

Other competencies/requirements/conditions:

- **Must achieve a C or better in all mathematics and science and writing courses.**
- **Completion of Stockton College Writing, Quantitative Reasoning, Arts, Historical Consciousness, Values/Ethics, and International/Multicultural Requirements.**

NOW THEREFORE, The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey and Gloucester County College agree to confirm in writing the terms and conditions of mutual and individual responsibilities related to the offering of this joint program.

IV. Term of Agreement

This Agreement shall continue in force for a period of five (5) years and shall commence on the date written above. This Agreement shall renew automatically each year thereafter unless terminated upon three months' prior written notice by either party to the other. If terminated, those students already enrolled in a course will be permitted to complete the course, and appropriate faculty instruction will be provided. No further enrollments shall be made under this arrangements after such notice is given.

V. General Provisions

There shall be no discrimination against any employee engaged in the work required to produce the services and programs covered by this Agreement, or against any applicant for such employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, sex, ancestry, marital status, nor handicap. This provision shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The parties of this Agreement do hereby agree that the provision of N.J.S.A. 10:2-1 through 10:2-4, dealing with discrimination in employment on public agreements, and the rules and regulations promulgated pursuant thereunto, as the same may be amended or modified.

Under this Agreement, both Gloucester County College and The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey shall continue to be autonomous and shall be governed independently by their respective governing bodies and administrations except insofar as this Agreement specifically states to the contrary.

It is understood and agreed that the parties to this Agreement may revise or modify this Agreement by written amendment when both parties agree to such amendment.

This Agreement shall be governed and construed and the rights and obligations of the parties hereto shall be determined in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey.

The parties agree that each party shall have responsibility for its own actions and those of its directors, officers, employees, students and agents, and nothing contained herein shall be considered a hold harmless agreement on the part of either party.

VI. Warranties

The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey and Gloucester County College do hereby warrant and represent that they are qualified by training and experience to perform the required services and programs in the manner and on the terms and conditions set forth herein. The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey and Gloucester County College further warrant and represent that this Agreement has not been solicited or secured, directly or indirectly, in a manner contrary to the laws of the State of New Jersey and that said laws have not been violated and shall not be violated as they relate to the procurement or performance of this Agreement by any conduct, including the paying or giving of any fee, commission, compensation, gift, gratuity, or consideration of any kind, directly or indirectly to any State employee, officer or official.

The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey and Gloucester County College administrators shall review the progress and policies of the Agreement at least once a year. Both institutions at any time may initiate changes to this articulation agreement. Both institutions reserve the right to propose modifications to the programs as deemed necessary and agree to inform the appropriate individuals of said changes and their impact on the terms of the articulation agreement.

VII. Entire Agreement

Both The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey and Gloucester County College acknowledge that this Agreement represents the entire agreement between the parties. All negotiations, oral agreements, and understandings are merged herein, and any change in the terms herein must be made in writing and signed by both parties.
