- Interest in course materials (Machlev & Karlin, 2016)
- Engagement in the classroom (Masek et al., 2019)
- Perceptions of instructor effectiveness (Shahid & Ghazal, 2019)

Ways to use humor in Kahoot

Answer options...one or two that are puns, non-sequiturs, or simply unexpected.

Questions...entire question is humorous. Relate the question to the material, or to the time of the semester.

Tips





Make the humorous question a poll rather than a quiz. Because all answers are humorous, any answer is correct.

End the Kahoot with a humorous question...

Using APA format is like...
