POLICY:

A degree may be awarded posthumously under the following conditions:

- The deceased student shall have is eligible for a posthumous degree if they have
 The student was enrolled in his/her/their final termthe last completed a minimum of 27550% of their degree program and in good standing.
- 1. , or otherwise nearing completion of his/her/their his or her graduation requirements.
- 2. If a student has completed less than 50% of their degree program or is not in good standing the program may be petitioned for posthumous degree conferral. At least seventy-five percent of the program faculty in which the student was enrolled agree that the student should receive the posthumous degree. This includes the program agreeing to waive remaining degree requirements.

- 2.4. The program in which the student was enrolled, as well as the The Office of the Provost, will also agree to waive any remaining degree requirements.
- 3-5. The posthumous degree may be seismay be noted in the commencement program but not on the actual diploma. The student's next of kin will be afforded a choice as to whether they want the conferral listed in the commencement program.
