

Dr. Carol Rittner, RSM, is Distinguished Professor of Holocaust & Genocide Studies Emerita, and Dr. Marsha Raticoff Grossman Professor of Holocaust Studies Emerita at Stockton University in Galloway, New Jersey. She has published numerous books and articles on the Holocaust and other genocides of the 20th century. Dr. Rittner has worked and lectured in both the Republic and the north of Ireland, the UK, Australia, Sweden, Israel, and Cambodia.

What is the relationship between teaching *about* the Holocaust and learning *from* the Holocaust? That is a question many teachers are increasingly asking. Can Holocaust education raise awareness of contemporary racism, antisemitism, Islamophobia, and threats to democracy? Can Holocaust education help to sow "seeds of concern" among students and others about what it means to be a citizen in a democracy? Can Holocaust education contribute to understanding and preventing future genocides? If so, how? Join us for an informative workshop on why it is important to teach the Holocaust in American classrooms today.


