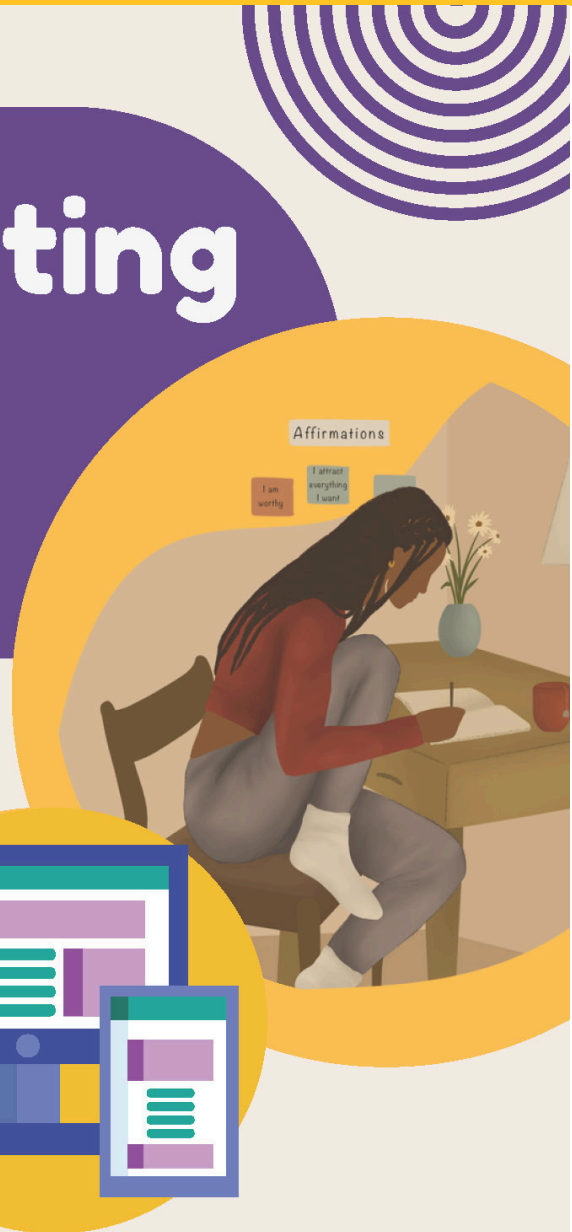

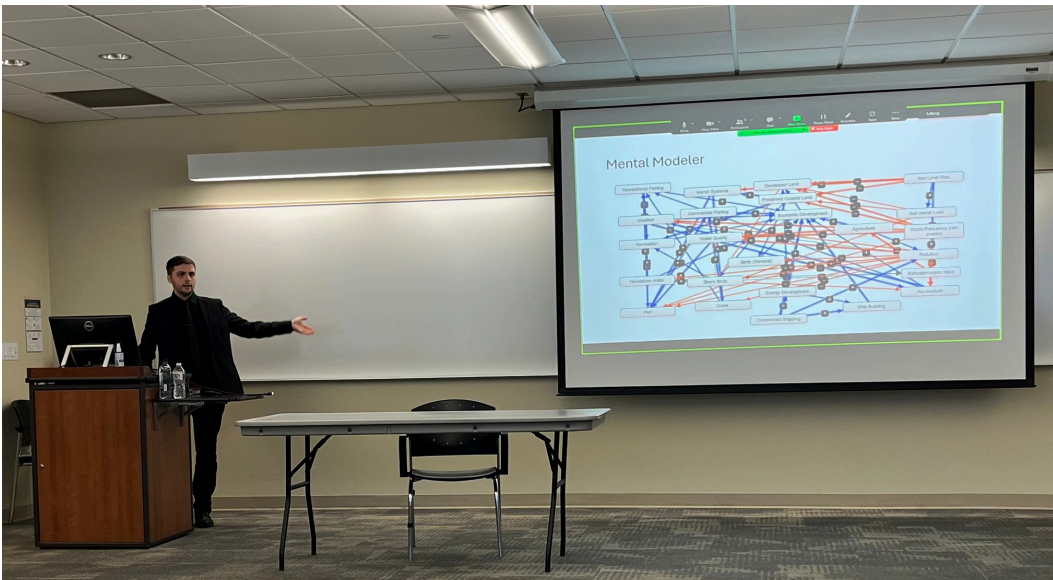
Master's in Counseling Program Granted Accreditation

The Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP) approved Stockton's Master of Arts in Counseling program at its July 2024 meeting. The university's program joins more than 950 master's and doctoral degree programs in Counseling and its specialized practice areas offered by more than 460 colleges and universities across the United States.



"I am very excited that the Counseling program has earned this remarkable achievement," said Marissa Levy, the dean of Stockton's School of Social and Behavioral Sciences. "The Master of Arts in Counseling is SOBL's signature program that's offered at Kramer Hall in Hammonton, and I look forward to it continuing to grow."

Coastal Zone Management Program Celebrates completion of FIRST master's thesis



Graduate Student Rory Hogan successfully defended the FIRST master's thesis from the Coastal Zone Management Program on April 2, 2024.

Rory's research explored how detached breakwaters could support beach replenishment projects to improve habitats for horseshoe crabs and migratory shorebirds.

MACJ Students and Faculty Shine at NEACJS Conference

In July, faculty and students attended the annual Northeastern Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences (NEACJS) Conference in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, where several presented research and also won significant awards.

Criminal Justice master's student Blake Cronin received the Michael Israel Graduate Student Scholarship, which is presented in honor of Mike Israel to recognize his contributions to public policy and criminal justice. The scholarship is awarded annually to a student pursuing a graduate degree in Criminal Justice or Criminology. Student nominees must have completed one semester of graduate study. Nominations are accepted from members of NEACJS and include a letter of recommendation and a copy of the student's resume. The selected scholarship recipient will receive a \$250 check, as well as a one-year student membership to NEACJS.

Recent graduate Casey Berchtold, who received her master's degree in Criminal Justice, won first place for the David Orrick Graduate Student Paper Award for her paper, "Elderly Inmates in the United States," which she also presented at the conference. Berchtold was also the student speaker during the master's and doctoral degrees ceremony in May.

Christine Tartaro, distinguished professor of Criminal Justice, and Ruibin Lu, assistant professor of Criminal Justice, won the Sage/CJPR-NEACJS Policy Paper Award for their paper, "The Impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic on Police Involvement in Mental Health Calls for Service," which they also presented at the conference.



Vice Provost Keenan Sworn In to N.J. State Board of Ed.

Stockton University Interim Vice Provost Claudine Keenan was sworn in in June 2024 as the newest member of the New Jersey State Board of Education. Keenan served as Dean of Stockton's School of Education from 2012 until transitioning to the interim vice provost position earlier this year. Governor Phil Murphy nominated Keenan to the 13-member board, and she was approved by the state Senate on June 28. Her term will expire on June 30, 2027.

Grant Funding in Archival Studies, Heritage Projects, and our Communities

From local history exhibitions to revitalizing a neighborhood, grant funding has a lot to do with projects you see all around you. This workshop will highlight a diverse range of projects that have been made possible through grant funding, such as supporting Indigenous-led food sovereignty, producing culturally-competent educational guides on Indigenous history in partnership with Indigenous communities, revitalizing public parks with Indigenous medicinal gardens and other food equity resources, cultural programming to welcome New Americans, and aging-in-place partnerships that promote intergenerational connections.

The program will cover grants (how to find them, research them, write them, and what to do once you've got one) from the perspective of someone who has been on both sides of the grant application process, as well as a brief interactive session designed to help participants practice the steps to identify a good match for their own goals in academia or the community.

Shilo Virginia Previti is a writer, researcher, and teacher currently living in Grand Forks, ND while working in nonprofits management with grant writing and reviewer experience in a broad range of topics from arts and humanities to built environment infrastructure and city planning. Previti was born near the marshy outskirts of noirish Atlantic City, NJ and is a graduate of Stockton University.

Prior to joining CR, Marta served at the Ford Foundation, the Aspen Institute, the Partnership for Public Service, and the office of Senator Bill Bradley of New Jersey—the state where she was raised following her family's journey from her birthplace of Havana, Cuba.

Marta's the author of "*Buyer Aware: Harnessing Our Consumer Power for a Safe, Fair, and Transparent Marketplace*," which chronicles the importance of consumer rights in creating an inclusive economy and strong democracy. Her expertise on issues consumers face has been featured in leading publications and broadcasts including CNN,

Forbes, Marketplace Morning Report, New York Magazine's Pivot podcast, and USA Today. She earned her Ph.D. in political science from Yale and a bachelor's degree from Fairleigh Dickinson University.
