

Stockton University Atlantic City Unveils Statue to Civil Rights Activist Fannie Lou Hamer

On October 10, 2023, Stockton unveiled a resin statue of the late Civil Rights Leader Fannie Lou Hamer, donated by Dr. Patricia Reid-Merritt after she received the statue as a gift from sculptor Brian Hanlon. The statue is currently on display at Jim Whelan Boardwalk Hall in Atlantic City, the site of the 1965 Democratic National Convention where Hamer famously gave testimony in opposition to an all-white Mississippi delegation, advocating for voting and civil rights for African-Americans.

The Fannie Lou Hamer Event Room on the Atlantic City campus is also dedicated to Hamer's legacy.

It is with great sadness that we share the loss of Stockton family member Gail Hirsch Rosenthal, director of the Sara and Sam Schoffer Holocaust Resource Center, who passed away on October 13, 2023.

Gail joined the Holocaust Resource Center in 1991, beginning her more than three decades of leadership at the university.

Gail's connections to the local community and Holocaust survivors were instrumental in helping the Center grow. The Center began as a single closet housing oral histories of local Holocaust survivors. Her significant work with countless community supporters helped the Center expand to its current size. The original room, now called the Gail Hirsch Rosenthal room, opened in 1990.







MSOT Students at the New Jersey Occupational Therapy Association's Annual Conference

In total, students presented seven posters. The conference was peerreviewed, and the students did a fantastic job representing themselves, the MSOT program, Stockton University, and the profession.









Remembering the Holocaust & Emigration:

The Moritz and Hammerschlag Families

Lennard Hammerschlag's parents, Wally (Moritz) and Lutz Hammerschlag were both young when the experiences of the Pogrom of November 1938 spurred their families to emigrate from Germany. Both families found refuge in the only place they could secure a visa: Rhodesia (today Zimbabwe). An exhibition about their experiences was installed in the Chabad at the Shore synagogue in 2017. Since then, Lennard continues to meet with Germans who are working to document the Jewish history of the towns where his parents were born, and to commemorate the horrors of the Holocaust. Lennard Hammerschlag and Dr. Michael Hayse will discuss what they have learned about the experiences of the extended Hammerschlag and Moritz families.


