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We are here to help you register for your classes! Your major and concentration will determine what you will need to take. Keep in mind that ALL FRESHMAN must have the following courses within your first year:

- W1-which is a writing course
- Q1-which is a math course
- Freshman Seminar-a course that consists of all freshman in which the instructor will help familiarize you to all of the different offices and services available at the university. This course may have nothing to do with your major, so pick a topic that interests you!
- After you have those 3 courses then you will select a course from your major.

*Note Stockton courses are 4 credits each;12 credits is considered full time, but most students take 16 credits to progress towards graduation



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Before we get started, you may have received a letter that is telling you certain courses that you MUST take! Take out that letter and register for those courses first. Some students are required to take prescribed writing or math courses. These courses may count as your W1, Q1, or freshman seminar requirements.



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A Writing Course (W1). If you were placed into a FRST Writing course, that is your Writing Course. If not, choose a course that is a **W1** course. Here are some examples: (note: FRST here means a section especially for freshmen)

- **FRST 2120-RHETORIC AND COMPOSITION.** There are multiple sections of this class at various days and times.
- **FRST 2131 OR GAH 2116-ARGUMENT AND PERSUASION in Arts and Humanities** There are multiple sections of this class at various days and times.
- **GEN 2240- INTRODUCTION TO RESEARCH. (Recommended for BSHS students, good foundational course for HLTH 3411-Writing and Editing for Health Sciences)** There are multiple sections of this class at various days and times.
- **FRST 2151 OR GSS 2121 -ARGUMENT AND PERSUASION IN THE SOCIAL SCIENCES.** There are multiple sections of this class at various days and times.



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If you do not take a writing course this semester, you need to take a Quantitative Course (Q1). Here are some suggestions:

If you are confident in your mathematics skills (and not placed into a required class):

MATH 1100 PRE-CALCULUS

CSIS 1206-STATISTICS There are multiple sections of this class at various days and times. (Some sections are restricted to certain majors.) This can count for HLTH 2305, Statistics for Health Professionals

If you are less confident in your math skills (and not placed into Developmental Math or Quantitative Reasoning), consider:

FRST 2310 ALGEBRAIC PROBLEM SOLVING, GNM 2310 ALGEBRAIC PROBLEM SOLVING, OR GNM 1126 INTERMEDIATE ALGEBRA. There are multiple sections of each class at various days and times. (Look up in computer lab). This also satisfies a W2 requirement.

If you were placed into Developmental Math or Quantitative Reasoning, then you **must** take that course.

For Developmental Math FRST 1103 you must select the same lecture and lab sections. Ex. If you enroll in FRST 1103-003 you must also enroll in the lab section FRST 1703-003.



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Okay, lets pause for a moment.....

Now you should have registered for 3 courses.....Your writing course (W1) your math course (Q1) and your freshman seminar.

- There are some exceptions to this rule, if you are considering the **3+3 Physical Therapy option**, you will want to register for BIOL 1200/1205 and CHEM 2110/2115 (Q2). You must add the lecture and the lab then hit submit.

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Now you can register for a course in your major. Make sure to refer to your DegreeWorks audit which is a roadmap of courses that you are required to take to graduate. The next slide will go over some options by major.

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If the courses in your major are all ready full, then you can consider taking a General Studies course.


You will need 8 of these courses before you graduate!

- GEN
- GAH
- GNM
- GSS

You can search in the subject line using the above general studies acronyms

GIS- must be a junior or above



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Another course option is call At Some Distance:

At some distance courses allow you to learn about **topics outside of your major**. For example, a Health Sciences major might take a course in Dance, Marine Biology, Philosophy, or Sociology. You will need at least four of these to graduate.



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In the fall you will be assigned a preceptor. Your preceptor will help you with academic advising, registration for future courses, career options, and other important decisions about your future.

Stockton University schedules 2 days off a semester in order for you to meet with your preceptor. Make sure you attend those valuable meetings.



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Keep in mind, that many of the clinical fields require you to complete graduate school in order to work in that field.

For physical therapy you must complete a Doctorate degree

For Speech/Communication Disorders you must complete a masters degree.

For Occupational Therapy you must complete a masters degree.

These graduate level programs are very competitive, so be sure to research what they require for admission.

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Other things to keep in mind:

If you are getting an error message when trying to register, click on the course restrictions, prerequisites, and corequisites.

Major Restriction: Only open to specified majors

Prerequisites: Courses that you must take before the course you are trying to register for

Corequisite: Course that you must take at the same time of the course you are trying to register for

If a course is full, you may opt to get a seat on the waitlist. You can use the drop down arrow to select waitlist when trying to register. Then keep an eye on your go.Stockton email account with instructions if you make it off of the waitlist. You will only have 24-48 hours to respond.

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Now that you are done registering, please go to the **GoPortal** and into your **Student Services Tab**. On the left hand side, scroll down to complete your Emergency Contacts. Also complete the TEXT alert contact with your cell phone information so that you will receive a text is school is closed ect.

Then, go to the **Bursars Tab** to review and print your bill.
