Special attention will be given to the strength of the high school curriculum (i.e. honors, A.P. courses). Current Stockton students who apply to this program should have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher.

Students Applying to Transfer to Stockton University Nursing from another Nursing Program:

Students who started a nursing program at another institution and wish to transfer will be evaluated by the nursing program on an individual basis.

Comparable nursing courses will be accepted if the student was enrolled in an accredited nursing program and earned at least a B in all nursing and science courses. A GPA of a B and a letter from the Dean of the Nursing Program stating that the student left the program in good standing is required. Transfer is based on seat availability. Students who meet requirements are not guaranteed admission.

Criminal Background Check and Drug Screen

Students must successfully pass a criminal background check and drug screen prior to beginning the first semester and again before starting clinical courses. Students must also successfully complete a criminal background check in order to be licensed as an RN in the State of New Jersey.

Students must meet the Technical Standards and Functions outlined by the program on admission and throughout the program.

*** Students must earn a grade of C or higher in all required sciences, general studies, and all non-clinical nursing courses to progress. Students must earn a grade of C+ or higher in all clinical nursing courses to progress.**

Admission Requirements for the Pre-Licensure Nursing Program

Admission to the four-year pre-licensure nursing program is highly competitive. Applicants for the program do not need to submit a separate application beyond Stockton University's standard application. However, students must indicate their interest in nursing by checking the appropriate box on the application. Please note that all application materials must be postmarked by May 15.

Meeting the following minimum conditions does not guarantee acceptance:

- Applicants should have completed 4 years of English, 3 years of a laboratory science (one of which should be Chemistry), 2 years of a foreign language, 3 years of math, 3 years of history.
- The Scholastic Aptitude Test or ACT is required. A minimum combined SAT score of 1190 with a Math score of 570 or a minimum ACT Math score of 24 is required.
- Applicants should have an overall high school GPA 3.5 or higher.
- 2 letters of recommendation from high school teachers or advisors are required.
