

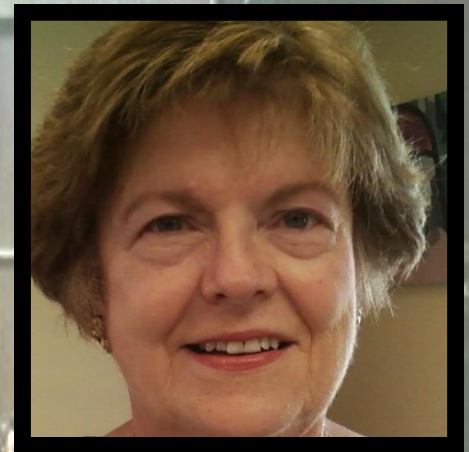

Mary Maudsley is an adjunct faculty member of the Holocaust and Genocide Program of Stockton University. A retired trial attorney, she was a Fellow of the Northwestern University Holocaust Education Foundation. She is the retired Chair of the New Jersey Supreme Court Disciplinary Review Board. As an attorney she specialized in ethics matters, discrimination issues, and state and local government litigation. She has been teaching about justice and the Holocaust for more than a decade. Her current research involves a 1979 libel trial between a Hungarian rabbi and a Distinguished Professor arising out of events during the Holocaust in Hungary. She received her BA and MA from Washington University St. Louis in Political Science. She received her JD from Temple University Law School and her second MA from Stockton University in Holocaust and Genocide Studies.
