SUMMARY STATEMENTS

Spring 2008 Enrollment

**New Students:**

Undergraduate: The **487** new undergraduates who registered this semester represent **12** first-time freshmen, **418** transfer students, and **57** readmitted students.

Graduate: The **62** new graduate students enrolled include **14** post-baccalaureate students and **48** new graduate students.

**Doctoral Program in Physical Therapy:**

There are currently **37** students enrolled in the DPT program and **72** students enrolled in the Transitional DPT program.

**Headcount & FTE:**

Total Population: There are **7,013** students registered, generating **5,937** FTE.

Undergraduate: The college enrolled **6,437** students this semester generating **5,626** FTE.

Graduate (including post baccalaureate): There are **576** students enrolled this semester with a corresponding FTE of **306**.

**Matriculated vs. Non-Matriculated Students:** The percentage of matriculated undergraduate students decreased from **98% to 97%** while the percentage of matriculated graduate students increased from **80% to 85%**.

**Credit Load:** Undergraduate credit load remained steady at **14** credits per student. Graduate students' average credit load increased slightly to **6.4**.

**AY 07-08 Annualized Headcount & FTE\*\***

**Total Population:** The combined annualized headcount is 7,184 students, which exceeds last year's figure by **1.6%**. Annualized FTE increased by **1.3%**.

**Undergraduate:** The AY07-08 annualized headcount for undergraduate students is **6,602** an increase of less than 1% from the AY06-07 annualized headcount. The corresponding FTE is **5,799** an increase of 1% over last year's figure of 5,756.

**Graduate (including post baccalaureate):** The graduate annualized headcount is **583**, an 18.5% increase, and **305** FTE, an 13.4% increase.
