Galloway Township, NJ- Temple Emeth Shalom will host its 17th annual "Salute to Stockton" lecture series which features faculty members from The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey.

Rabbi Gordon Geller, a longtime Stockton faculty member in the School of General Studies, said the talks are always one of the highlights of the year at his congregation as well as a cultural community highlight.

All speeches will take place on Fridays in the Temple sanctuary during Sabbath eve services starting at 7:30 p.m. Temple Emeth Shalom is located at 8501 Ventnor Ave. in Margate. The events are free and open to the public. A question and answer period will follow the lectures.

The schedule of speakers is as follows:

Friday, July 11: Dr. Judith Vogel will present, "The Holocaust in Children's Literature," examining how to teach the Holocaust using children's literature, when it is effective and when it is not. Dr. Vogel is an associate professor of Mathematics and teaches a class on children and the Holocaust in Stockton's Holocaust and Genocide Studies undergraduate program.

Friday, July 18: William McKnight will discuss the prominent issues confronting local police. McKnight is an adjunct instructor of Criminal Justice and retired captain of the Atlantic City Police Department.

Friday, July 25: Dr. Laura Taylor will give a presentation on injection safety and patient safety. Dr. Taylor is an adjunct instructor in Public Health and works for the New Jersey Department of Health in the Communicable Disease Service.
