Worker's Compensation is a statutory benefit governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey to provide wage replacement due to job-related injuries or death.

If an accident occurs on the job, injuries must be reported to the employee's direct supervisor and the Office of Human Resources immediately, but in no case later than 24 hours from the time of the accident. If these offices are closed, Campus Police must be notified. A State of New Jersey Employer's First Report of Accidental Injury or Occupational Disease Form must be completed and received by the Office of Human Resources. Employees must be sure to adhere to accident reporting guidelines so that employee will not be adversely affected and so that medical care can be rendered effectively and quickly. Unless emergency medical treatment is required, employees may only use physicians referred by the University. Treatment by physicians other than those authorized by the University will not be compensable.

An employee who misses work as a result of a workplace injury should always consult with the Office of Human Resources to review and discuss options for continuation of pay.
