Adjunct Faculty Opportunity Fund (AFOF) - FY20 Spring

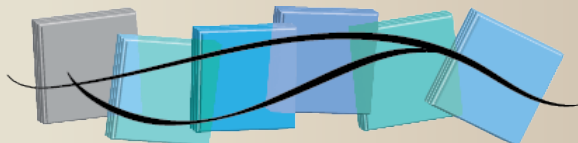
- Support for Adjuncts, 1/2 and 3/4 time faculty.

Fundamental Science Research on Mind and Body Approaches (R21 Clinical Trial Optional)

United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS)
National Institutes of Health (NIH)
National Center for Complementary and Integrative Health (NCCIH)

Deadline: Jan 7, 2020 (AIDS related applications), Feb 16, 2020 (New applications), Mar 16, 2020 (Resubmission, Revisions)

Amount: Upper \$275,000 - The number of awards is contingent upon NIH appropriations and the submission of a sufficient number of meritorious applications. The combined budget for direct costs for the two-year project period may not exceed

\$275,000. No more than \$200,000 may be requested in any single year. The total project period may not exceed 2 years.

Abstract: This funding opportunity announcement (FOA) encourages exploratory /developmental research grant applications (R21) to investigate the fundamental science of mind and body approaches, including mind/brain-focused practices (e.g., meditation, hypnosis), body-based approaches (e.g., acupuncture, massage, spinal manipulation/mobilization), meditative exercise (e.g., yoga, tai chi, qi gong), art and music therapies, or integrative approaches combining several components. Studies of pharmacologic approaches exclusively are not included in the scope of this FOA.
