Please provide a summary of the project and your experience.

The goal is to internationalize Stockton by initiating an MOU with UTSM in Chile. This will be achieved with three activities. First, presenting, then publishing, internationally collaborative research (wine sustainability data from NJ & Santiago region of Chile) with colleague from partner University (UTSM - Chile), at an internationally recognized academic meeting (Association of Wine Economists – Padua, Italy). Second, bring in an expert speaker from our partner university overseas to present on economic and environmental issues in Chile (mining, fisheries, wine) at Stockton. This will benefit programs in SUST, ENVL, HTMS, ECON, MBA, PSM, MARS, GEOL, and the Caribbean/Latin American, Global Studies, and Spanish minors or concentrations. Third, to develop curriculum for students to travel to Chile, for a short-term study abroad program. This combined vision will have a strong impact on Stockton! Having an international guest speaker, collaborative/comparative and interdisciplinary presented and published research, and the opportunity for students to study in Chile starting fall semester 2018 will further our goal and reputation for excellence.

This request for funding leverages matching funds from within Stockton and UTSM.

 First, conference presentation at an international conference with subsequent publication of research in peer review journal (ideally Journal of Wine Economics or Society & Natural Resources). Also, it allows the opportunity to network and collaborate with other foreign scholars, apply for grants within the wine industry, and develop other MOUs with other universities around the world. Success will be measured by presentation of research and publication of research paper.

- 2) Allowing students, faculty and community to learn about interdisciplinary research from a scholar from South American and further globalize our campus. Success will be measured by number of students/faculty/staff attending the lectures and the publication of the visit in local papers, Stockton Times and maybe Presidents report. Ideally this will begin the exchange of lecturers between Stockton and UTSM more regularly.
- 3) Develop another short-term international opportunity for students to study abroad. The course will be interdisciplinary, and collaborative between Stockton and UTSM. Many students don't have the money or time to study abroad for a semester or more this short term opportunity can bolster Stockton's numbers of study abroad and globalize education for our generally regional students. Success measured by successful development of a field-study study abroad course.
