To increase the diversity of the registered nurse (RN) workforce, Stockton University must attract a diverse student population; and must retain these students once they are enrolled. Tutoring services for writing and math are offered; however, there are no tutoring services specifically for nursing courses. Survey results from Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 accelerated BSN (ABSBN) students indicated a strong desire for tutoring services, particularly in early nursing courses such as pharmacology and pathophysiology. Often, students from underrepresented populations struggle the most in the rigorous nursing program.

Two paths to becoming a registered nurse (RN) are available at Stockton University; the traditional 4-year and the accelerated BSN program. Four-year students attend classes on the main campus in Galloway. ABSBN students attend classes year-round at the Manahawkin Instructional Site; two start times are offered each year for ABSBN students, fall and spring (2 cohorts).

High school may not have adequately prepared students for college. This is especially true in the post Covid-19 pandemic and may impact students from underrepresented populations to a greater degree. ABSBN students have a college degree but may have graduated years ago and do not have adequate study habits. Students in both programs may not be prepared for the time required to be successful. ABSBN students often work and have families.

In the past, when a nursing student required tutoring services, a member of the Nursing Club would volunteer to provide tutoring services. Currently, the majority of members in the undergraduate Nursing Club are freshman and sophomore students; these students have not enrolled or complete nursing courses as these courses traditionally start in the spring of the sophomore year. Many junior and senior nursing students are employed as Patient Care Technicians (PCTs) at local hospitals and do not have time to tutor. The ABSBN program at the Manahawkin instructional site has grown; there has not been access to peer tutors as nursing faculty have provided needed tutoring.

Students that could benefit for tutoring services can be identified in several ways. Nursing faculty may identify students who are struggling in their courses. If a nursing student receives a grade less than 80 on an exam, nursing faculty currently complete a "Nursing Student Occurrence Form." A recommendation would be to participate in the peer-tutoring program. Students could also self-identify that they are struggling in the nursing courses.

A peer tutoring program, for nursing is proposed to help all nursing students to be successful, graduate, and pass the NCLEX-RN. Successful completion of a nursing degree and passing the NCLEX-RN ensures a career with good wages and benefits.

Peer-tutoring will be offered in-person or virtually. For the 4-year undergraduate program on the main campus in Galloway, students may meet one-to-one or in small groups in tutoring center, library, or other areas. Students may also elect to meet with tutor via zoom. For the ABSBN program at the Manahawkin Instructional Site, students can meet one-to-one or in small groups in a reserved classroom or conference room. Students may also choose to meet virtually as the Manahawkin Instructional site is not open on weekends and offers limited evening hours during the week.

Five tutors will be hired; two in the undergraduate (Galloway) and three for the ABSBN (Manahawkin). Tutors will be recruited through announcements from the Nursing Clubs, flyers, and classroom announcements. Tutor selection will be based on a strong academic background of a GPA of 3.0 or higher; having successfully passed the course requiring the tutor or current enrollment in the course requiring the tutor. Tutors will be paid an hourly rate for tutoring services.

Luis Pena from the Tutoring Center on Main Campus has agreed to include nursing peer tutors in classes offered throughout the semester. Class topics include “managing expectations” and “managing stress.” The Tutoring Center has access to software; however, this software has limited capabilities.

Strategic Impact

- How will this project clearly address the primary strategic area of focus chosen above?

Area of focus: **Teaching and Learning**-a peer tutoring program would assist all students to successfully complete the nursing program, pass the NCLEX-RN exam, secure a job with good wages and benefits.

Other areas of focus: **Inclusive Student Success**: The nursing program is rigorous; often students from underrepresented populations struggle the most.

Diversity and Inclusion: Students from underrepresented populations struggle the most academically.

Strategic Enrollment Management: Students in the ABSN program represent a more diverse student population. This program seeks to enroll 36 students for the fall start program and up to 36 in the spring start program. Students in the ABSN program have a previous college degree, attend the program year-round, and graduate in approximately 15 months.

If this program is successful, other programs at Stockton may wish to use this model to develop peer tutoring programs.

Nursing students from both the traditional 4-year undergraduate program and the accelerated BSN program will report services available helped to ensure their success. Reduction in the number of students who must repeat a nursing course because they did not receive the grade required to progress in the program, graduate, and take the NCLEX-RN, and secure a job with good wages and benefits. Students not passing a nursing course must repeat the course, adding this additional cost. This additional cost may be more the cost of more than one course as many nursing courses include a lab or clinical portion and students not receiving a passing grade in the classroom are required to repeat the lab or clinical portion as well. Future employment is delayed as well as undergraduate nursing courses are offered one time per year and students needing to repeat a course have to wait a year until that course is offered again. Students in the ABSN program who need to repeat a course need to wait 3 to 6 months as courses are offered twice per year due to having 2 cohorts.
