Approval of Minutes: President Dambroski motioned to approve the minutes of April

25th, 2017 and is seconded by Chairperson Ritter.

Agenda/Business: Stockton Student Senate met on September 26th, 2017 to discuss Student ID changes, discuss recent White Supremacist actions on campus, vote on Supplemental Requests from student clubs, and to listen to the Open Forum on the Bust of Richard Stockton.

President's Report

President Dambroski said she looks forward to the Open Forum scheduled directly after the conclusion of the meeting. She thanked those community members who attended the Unite Against Hate Rally, hosted Thursday, September 21st. She reaffirmed the views and ideals that comprise Identity Evropa are not supported or condoned by the Student Senate. She encouraged any and all people of the Stockton Community to get involved in this process, and help the Student Senate develop a call to action, so that no voice goes unheard.

She has been working closely with the administration and the Student Trustee on the Exhibit Steering Committee, which focuses largely on the effects and future impacts of Richard Stockton and his legacy on the University. President Dambroski reported she met with registrar to discuss the possibility of crisis hotlines and University services contact information to be placed on the backs of student identification cards, at the request of the student organization "Active Minds." She looks forward to continuing collaboration with this organization in events specifically such as, Suicide Prevention Month, which Senator Katie Coburn has presided as the Student Senate representative on the planning committees. In the upcoming month, President Dambroski hopes to receive confirmation of the addition of a legal adviser on campus for students receiving their education under Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, or DACA.

Vice President's Report

Vice President Hanvey felt strongly about addressing the hostile climate of our campus. She affirmed that Student Senate will never accept hate speech or allow hate to affect our students, without addressing the topic and diminishing it with love. The Vice President stated on her behalf that she will not condone hate speech on campus and continued to find a resolution to make students feel safe. The Vice President looks forward to continuing the movement to express love and diversity on campus, and to make every student feel safe.

The Vice President mentioned she has been working with the academic affairs committee to write a resolution to make change for the "retaking a course" policy. She met with

Peter Hagan to help write the verbiage of the resolution to approach at the next full student senate meeting.

Finance

Chairperson Ryan Greene reported that the Finance Committee approved two Supplemental Requests. Chairperson Ryan Greene asks Co-Presidents of the Active Minds club about their "Suicide Prevention Month". The Co-Presidents of the Active Minds club provide information about their club.

President Dambroski addresses a motion on the table to pass a supplemental in the amount of \$6,131.40 for Suicide Prevention month.

Chairperson Ryan Greene calls for a Point of Information and explains the amendments to the Supplemental Request, citing errors in student invoices.

Chairperson Ryan Greene moves to pass a supplemental in the amount of \$5,770. Chairperson Watt seconds the motion.

Jeff Wakeman asks for further elaboration on the amendments that were made in the Finance Committee meeting.

President Dambroski addresses a motion on the table to pass a supplemental in the amount of \$5,770. Senator Santiago seconds this motion.

The motion passes, 20 - 0 - 1, with President Dambroski abstaining.

Chairperson Greene addresses the second Supplemental Request for the Dance Club's American College Dance Association's Northeast Conference at Montclair State University in the amount of \$6,900.

Chairperson Greene moves to pass a supplemental in the amount of \$6,900. Vice President Hanvey seconds the motion.

Academic Affairs

Chairperson Moore welcomed all students back for the academic year and hoped everyone is ready to have a productive year of learning. A joint statement was then released from Executive Vice President Susan Davenport Monday, evening October 16th, to provide detail to the Stockton Community of how the requests in the Resolution FA17-01 will be adequately addressed. This week Trustee Madeleine Deininger hosted a brown bag lunch, with a small group of students, President Kesselman, Executive Vice President Susan Davenport, Deputy Chief of Staff Lolita Treadwell, Ellen Bailey, Tom Roth and Trustee Raymond R. Ciccone. Including a number of student trustees and student senators, the conversation was light. Trustee Deininger provided us with many tales of her days as an undergraduate student here at Stockton and allowed students to further discuss areas of strengths and weaknesses for our campus. We look forward to another brown bag lunch on November 2nd, and encourage all available to attend.

In the coming months, President Dambroski hopes to organize more mentorships through the Students Helping Students, Student Senate initiative. Students helping Students initiative is a program that takes Stockton students out of the main campus in Galloway to build relationships and provide mentorship to students of the Atlantic City Community. In addition to this, President Dambroski is hoping to develop roundtable discussions for student leaders to come together on campus to speak out and up about issues found on our campus. The purpose of the roundtable discussion is to create time for all student leaders to collaborate. Eventually including Atlantic City mentees into the meetings as well, to build on their personal and professional leadership skills.

Suicide Prevention Month is in full gear. President Victoria Dambroski says while this a topic she holds dear to her heart, suicide is something that affects many people for many reasons, but it can be prevented. Senator Onuwa, in collaboration with the Stockton University Physical Therapy club, has begun developing a "30/30" event that will be an hour even dedicated to helping further students along their academic journey. The first 30 minutes of the event will be used to teach students pressure points to reduce stress and relax with instruction from a professional massage therapist and the next 30 minutes of the event will utilize tutors from the Tutoring Center to assist students in their schoolwork. Senator Vece has begun filling seats in the Library Advisory Board and will be expressing concerns to extend library hours on Fridays. Senator Gonzalez-Mejia has been working closely with the William J.
