Approval of Minutes

Carl called the meeting to order at 4:30 pm and moved to approve the minutes, seconded by Nucci.

Motion Passed: 26-0-1

President's Report

Carl announced that this was the first meeting as Stockton University, and that they had a great turn out for the Celebration, with Alumni, Faculty, Staff, and Students. Carl thanked everyone who was involved in the Food Survey, they had a record breaking 1568 students take this survey, which was 20% of the student body. Carl will be meeting with Jeff and Craig to discuss the feedback, and will be working with Thomasa Gonzalez, Vice President for Student Affairs, to take action on these issues. Carl also announced that there were free coupons available to those who took the food security survey, thanks to chartwells. Carl also said that he met with Atlantic City High School to discuss their Student's Helping Student's Program, and the High School was excited to further this program. They will be meeting with them next Thursday to discuss their plans for this Day of Service Activity. Anyone who is interested in this Day of Service activity please reach out to them. Carl said that he would be meeting with Kiyle, Louis and Charles Ingram, Vice President for Administration & Finance, to discuss how much money they will be able to allocate for Clubs and Organizations next year. He also announced that the annual Etiquette Dinner will be held on March 4th at 5:30 PM in the Campus Center Event Room, and tickets will be on sale for \$5.00. This year there will be an Alumni reception added on there, so that students can network with Alumni. So students should definitely come out for this event. He also said that the SGA task force meeting will be tonight and every Tuesday following in room F225 at 8:00PM and that everyone who is interested in being a part of the conversation, to please stop by.

Vice President's Report

Louis congratulated everyone for getting to experience being able to be a part of this great institution now as a University. He then encouraged students to take the EBI, housing survey that takes about 15 minutes to fill out. They will be raffling off several prizes including a Play Station 4. This survey helps the university pin point where the student's needs are, especially as residents. Louis then thanked the UP-To-US team, especially Victoria, Maryam, Brad, and Angelo for all of the hard work that they put in during the past four weeks. He explained what a great experience all of it was; getting to meet with the Congressman LoBiondo, also meeting with Representative Cory Booker, as well as getting closer to faculty and students in regards to the national debt issue. This was an exciting experience he had as well as working with all of the team and the bonds he got to make. He then announced that he is excited to have more time to focus on the student's needs.

Academic Affairs:

Nick announced that he will be working with the SGA task force to see what clubs want from the Student Senate and how they can better represent them, to hopefully progress more to becoming a student government. He also said that Mike has been working on Constitution amendments and hopefully they will be sent out within the week. Nick also said that Mike is looking out for courses for academic advising, for a layout of majors and double concentrations, in order to better help students get an idea of what classes they will need. He'll also be looking into what the course outcomes will be in putting these classes towards student's degrees. Right now on the CAPP you can only see your one major, but they are also looking into being able to view double majors on the CAPP as well. Nick went on to report that Victoria is looking into issues with renting books from the library. Right now if you rent a book from the library and you misplace it and it is a \$10.00 book, you will be charged \$45.00 for that book. They are looking into if someone purchases that book brand-new if they would be able to give the new book in as compensation opposed to having to pay the fine. Nick yielded the floor back to Carl.

Government Affairs:

Angelo was very excited to be able to call Stockton now a University. Angelo wanted to eco Louis's report, in thanking the Up-To-Us team, Brad, Maryam, Victoria, Louis, and Laurie and Craig, because without them, the Up-To-Us team would not have been the same. He wanted to also let everyone know about the impact that this team truly had on the University, because originally they had intended on just raising awareness of the 18 trillion dollars in debt the nation had, and the impact that it would have on the new millennium generations. Each year there has been a progression of people joining the Up-To-Us campaign two years ago with 13 teams, to 23 campuses, when Stockton joined in, and now there are 44 states that have joined in. They are hoping that soon all 50 states will be able to be aware of this crisis. First they started off with their Kick off Panel, January 29th 2015, that had 50-60 person turnout, in the Campus Center Theater; which was a great turn out. Then they had the life-sized monopoly, where they expected about 75 people to come out, but they ended up with 140 people who swiped in. They had additional people come in, but they had such a great turn out that they physically couldn't accept any more people to play monopoly. They then had their democracy café, with people who are likeminded about the national debt issue. Then they had My Two Cents Day, where students walked into the Grand Hall, where they hung signs that said they sold all of their furniture to help pay off the national debt, which wasn't true, but to raise awareness about this crisis. They are at second place for the Facebook pledge, right below Texas State. They will find out on Friday whether they won the competition or not. The panel is made up of Chelsea Clinton, George Stephanopoulos, the Mayor of Oklahoma City Mick Cornett, and Congressman Joaquin Castro from Texas. They will be submitting their final documentation to find out if they win on Friday. Angelo said that if they win they will go as a team to Miami and be recognized on the CGIU Stage by Bill Clinton and Hilary

Clinton may be there if she does not have other plans. He thanked everyone for their support. Angelo also announced that they did not have a committee meeting the previous week, but they will be meeting further in the week and updating one another on what business needs to be done. Angelo yielded the floor to Maryam and she thanked all of the students who took the pledge, which was 1,750 students from Stockton, and they could not have done it without the students. She also asked for a round of applause from the students. Maryam yielded the floor to Angelo, who then yielded it back to Carl.

Public Relations:

Lauren announced that the Queen of Heart Dance on February 10th had a great turnout of 50 people, and they raised \$50 for the Go Red for woman cause, from donations and people who came. They had another basketball game fundraiser and announced that they have raised \$700 so far for the Foundation Scholarships. She is looking forward to holding more fundraisers to raise their goal of \$1000 for the foundation. Lauren also said that in G wing you can find their events posted. She went on to say that their Quizzo event had a great turnout, and Zayhira was there to help as well. She also announced that another collaboration event with the Campus Center will be T-shirt Decorating, which is going to be March 30th, and they are going to try and tie in Relay for life, so they can come and work on their T-shirts for that. The committee is also planning to host another fundraiser and are hoping to do that with Buffalo Wild Wings. Students can go there as a group and show the event flyer and Buffalo Wild Wings will donate money to them for their scholarship. Lauren also said that student senate interest meetings are March 3rd to March 5th, at 8PM in L112. They already have a PowerPoint for this meeting so they are ready to go. She went on to say that the Meet the Candidate Event is March 30th at 8PM in the Coffee House, the presidential speeches are going to be held on April 11th in room F111 at 8PM, so this will help students decide who they want to vote for next year. She also said that elections will be held on April 14th-16th from 12PM-12PM, and there will be an email sent out on the Go portal so look out for that. Lauren also reported that Victoria is working on a scrapbook so they can use this in Public Relations for next year, and she will hopefully have that finished by the end of this year to show all of the things that the Student Senate has been doing this past year. She also said that the committee is also working on making a snap chat account that will start during election time. Students will also be able to see when and what days and events are happening. The idea is a continuation of a "this week at Stockton email", but it would be called, "What Is Going On at Stockton" and the elections will be their first trial to see how it works out. Lauren yielded the floor back to Carl.

Student Affairs Committee:

Murphy announced their committee was unable to meet because of the snow, but they have been chatting and discussing business via the Internet. Ar-Rasheed has been working with Wellness Center as well as Plant Management, through Marina and Katelyn for the possibility of providing toilet seat covers for staff and students to use. Marina and

Katelyn have been continuing to work on Veteran's Park moving the flowerpot blocking the American Flag as well as adding and fixing lights to be solar charged to light up the flags. They are going to have a drop box or an event so that students can properly dispose of batteries, and other toxic items that could affect the environment. Christian has been working with Lonnie Folks is helping get rid of the old equipment and the broken equipment in I-wing gym. They are trying to table and talk to telecommunications to discuss with students about Wi-Fi issues directly. Murphy also reported that she has been working with Residential Life association, James Timothy, in getting "rules signs" so that the machines in the laundry room will not break as often. She has also been talking with Denise O'Neil is discussing the Gender inclusive housing that will be provided on the freshmen side. Her committee has tabled with the public relations committee for "Sweets for Your Suggestions" and they will be sorting through the complaints and complements and distributing them to the proper committee. Finally, they have received complaints about the size of the veterans lounge. She went on to report that Haley Matsinger, Finance Committee Member, has been receiving lot of complaints about the veteran's lounge, which is about a 12x12 area. There are about 10-16 students in the lounge, but there are 400 veterans on campus. First it started out as a petition, but since the Student Senate supports this, it is now a Support Group. She collected 572 student's signatures in support of giving the veterans a bigger lounge, especially, because it is not wheel chair accessible, and getting the signatures she ran into a lot of veterans in the library who said that they were in the library, because there lounge is always full and they can't get anything done. She will be working with Tom, and any Senators who would like to help can Facebook her or talk to her later. Murphy yielded the floor back to Carl.

Finance Committee:

Announcements/Comments from the Public

Carl Louis from the SVO, who is the public relations officer said thank you for approving their supplemental to attend the national 2015 conference in San Antonio, with an additional two members totaling four people who were able to attend, because of the additional funds they were provided. This conference displayed what each veteran has accomplished and is fighting for on campus. They are ensuring that campus' provided proper information, that will help set them up to be sent off to where they are headed next in their journey. Nine hundred SVA chapters came to the conference. Out of the 900 there were 400 representatives. Facebook exploded with a growth rate of 200%. They had 3,000 tweets on twitter and 3,700. The Vice President Joe Biden felt a need to address these issues with the benefits for the veterans. Already he is taking the pyramid and helping better the package for veterans. Next year this conference will be at Disney World and the following Year they would like to bring more people to the conference to raise awareness and ensure that veterans are better helped with their packets.

Ar-Rasheed said that he was sitting in the campus center and a student stopped him and asked how he could get involved in running for student senate. He wanted to know how the funds from student senate are allocated because they are not public. Louis responded by saying that the senate budget is compiled as one budget request. If you request to see the budget, student development can provide you with that information. You can look at the previous semester and you are able to see the allocated supplemental money and

senate budget. Louis said he would be looking into how to make this more accessible to the public.

Nelson Gonzalez, President of SVO, thanked the Student Senate for all of their help. He explained that they have been doing a lot on and off campus and they are hoping to expand their group the following year. They are trying to expand their table group out to the public. Thursday March 5th they are holding an event from 11:00am-2:00. They have invited people from the Philadelphia VA Hospital and they will have an open house and town Hall meeting. They will be providing information for benefits for vets and what they are eligible for as far as healthcare, as well as for their family. Afterwards they will be having a questionnaire afterwards. They have a Relay for Life Team with 14 members.

Ian, a junior, came up and thanked the Student Senate and the Veterans Organization for their service. He then went on to say that he was humbled that the Student Senate took up a Food bank initiative. He is glad that this is an issue that is going to be addressed. He feels that the food bank may be a Band-Aid to the issue, because Chartwells is a monopoly. He feels that the gross profit is 75-80%. He is not sure that having a food bank is a solution. He feels that they should engage in social action in educating students on how to pack lunches. He would like to see more raised awareness of taking a social action. Carl asked him to stay after the meeting ended, so that they could talk about some ideas.

Cristian Moreno announced that he would be stepping down from the Student Senate so that he can better help the immigrant community. He thanked the student Senate as well as Pedro Santa for his great mentoring throughout his freshmen year. Carl thanked him for his great service on student senate, and wished him the best of luck; and that he knew he would do great things in whatever he chooses to do.

The committee discussed the results of the Up to Us campaign, and went over the conference schedule and some pointers on dealing with media at CGIU. The committee briefly discussed a game plan for the use of the \$10,000 prize money. Angelo briefly explained to the committee the plan for future years of Up to Us at Stockton and other initiatives to raise awareness about the national debt. The committee is proud to announce that by winning the Up to Us competition we have succeeded in raising awareness about the national debt at Stockton by reach 1758 Facebook pledge takers. By doing so we checked off one of our committee goals for the academic year. The committee also discussed Maryam's idea of a second Higher Education Week. More information on Higher Ed week will be released and discussed later on in the month.

The interest meetings went well with a total of 41 candidates who came out to run in the spring election. One interest meeting was added to give students an extended opportunity to run if they couldn't make it to the other meetings, and because one was cancelled due to the snow day. The mandatory Campaign Rules meeting will be on April 2nd, and after that campaigning is allowed to start. Meet the Candidates is scheduled for April 7th at 8 pm in the coffeehouse, and the itinerary has already been planned out. Presidential speeches are happening on April 9th at 8 pm in F-111. Elections are the following week on April 14-16th from 12pm-12pm and the ballot will be found on the GoPortal.

The Five Guys Burgers and Fries fundraiser took place on March 26th and raised \$108 to go toward our fundraiser. One more fundraiser is planned for Buffalo Wild Wings on April 8th from 12pm-12am, and \$100 will be donated to us for every \$1000 made at Buffalo Wild Wings that night. We are trying to plan one other fundraiser before the end of the semester.

In conjunction with Student Affairs, Public Relations will table to inform students that their WiFi problems can be solved by contacting the help desk. Only 12 complaints total have been received by the help desk in regards to WiFi and there is concern that students are not informed enough about the WiFi options if the connection is not sufficient. We are also working with them to make flyers to hang around residence halls and bulletin boards to direct students if their WiFi connection is unsatisfying.

Student Senate tabled at the "Day in the Life" for incoming freshman interested in potentially coming to Stockton. Senate will also be taking part in Phoenix nightmarket on April 3rd from 8-11 pm. This is a collaborative effort between multiple clubs and will be a "fair/festival" format where clubs have a game related to their club with prizes to win. Senate is possibly going to have a trivia game. We are also working on a "Wear Stockton Day" where we would give out free baked goods to students showing their school spirit. Since the State of the University Address has changed dates, Public Relations will work to promote this in the next few days when the date gets closer.
