#### **President's Report**

President Archut Jr. mentioned that after the President and Vice President reports the Committee reports will begin with Finance Committee because of student needs. Lets Talk about Stockton was on October 1st, 2015 and there were 200 students in attendance. It was a great event with lots of questions and concerns brought up by students. Currently, all concerns from the students are being discussed within the Academic and Student Affairs committees. Carl went on to report that due to the shooting at Umpqua Community College in Oregon that he has been working with a team to rebrand Stockton's emergency preparedness campaign. Updates will be sent out soon. He also reported that the search for the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs Committee Meeting went well. Updates can be seen on the Stockton's Website if you search Provost Search Committee. Carl also said that he met with Brian Tyrrell, Faculty Senate President, with Vice President Nick Persia in talks about Academics Affairs issues. Carl went on to say that had lunch with State Senator Krylos, with a few other senatos, and there was great conversation including talks about the Snookie Bill. Carl also reported that he and Carly are working on developing a campaign for Sexual Assault Awareness' in April. He encouraged senators to get involved. He also said that he met with the diversity committee on October 20th; and talked about the diversity issues and how Stockton is planning on taking better strides to address issues of diversity and inclusion. Carl met with President Kesselman on October 22<sup>nd</sup>; and discussed parking issues. He also said that the first Careers in Student Affairs Conference went really well. The sessions were great and really helped better inform attendees about potential careers in Student Affairs. Carl also met with Bob Heinrich on the 29<sup>th</sup> about the creation of a food finder app for Stockton, more updates are to come. On the 29<sup>th</sup> he will be attending a Parking committee meeting and he'll also be meeting with the Task Force for AC Initiatives on October 30<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Vice President's Report**

Nick was absent so Carl gave his report on Students Helping Students program is making great progress. If you have any questions on Students Helping Students program please reach out to Nick. Chair Emily swore in the New Senators in place for Nick.

#### **Academic Affairs**

Emily yield the floor to Brian. Brain has been working on the diploma research and a resolution has been created for the addition of majors for the diplomas. After he presents the information, he makes a moves to approve the resolution that will have Stockton University diplomas include the students' major of study, which was seconded by Victoria. Maryam moved to table it back to committee, which was seconded by Haley. The motion failed: 1-19-2. The senate voted on the original motion to approve the resolution that would have Stockton University include students' major course of study on their diplomas. Motion passed: 19-0-3. Emily moved to approve a resolution that would recommend a change to the current attendance policy at Stockton, which would add to the excusable absences for the concern of student safety. This motion was seconded by Patton. Motion passed: 17-3-1

Emily had a meeting with the registrar is scheduled to address and final concerns before we bring it to the full senate floor. Mackenzie and Emily had met with the tutoring center. They were informed of the services provided by the tutoring center. To better inform the students of the resources available for student's academia and for any other concerns students may have Toyo has been reaching out to other club and organizations to discuss a possible collaboration program. Emily has also been in contact with a student who had a concern about the course competitiveness at Stockton. The academic affairs committee is looking to create a list of future courses and programs that will be offered, as well as take suggests for new programs and courses. Emily has been in contact with Tom Grites address a concern about the IDEA evaluations. A student felt uncomfortable when they were asked to fill out their IDEA evaluation while their professor was still in the classroom. Tom Grites is looking to propose this concern to the provost senior staff. Tom also provided information about when student athletes are able to register for class.

The Provost's Council has already approved and will in operation for the Spring 2016 early registration. All Student-Athletes must be eligible for competition. These Student-Athletes must have no "Holds" on their registration. The Student-Athletes will register early only for the season(s) in which they compete. The Student-Athletes would be eligible to register during the first time slot on the day which they would normally register within their Class Status, that is, first of the Seniors, first of the Juniors, etc.

#### **Student Affairs**

Victoria started the meeting by assigning Noya to writing minutes. Victoria delegated Ryan and Carly to share the responsibility of carrying out one of the team's of getting special food services to cater to special holidays. The three of them will also be creating a survey to determine students' need for accommodations on the weekends on campus. Victoria assigned Noya addressing the concern for students' wants and needs of the convenient store and lake lodge on the residence halls on the upper classmen side on campus. She will be working with Trish Krevetski to create a survey to determine what students want. Student Affairs also met with Brianne Finley at both committee meetings to address the concern Big Blue not accommodating all students. Student Affairs worked with Brianne to make an appropriate survey for students to determine whether or not the student body would be willing to pay for the service that they already pay for only the athletic students to have. This extra funding would have to occur because there are not enough trainers to accommodate all students as is. Student Affairs also discussed having a clothing sect for the winter, somewhat like the Jeans for teens, except with worn coats on campus. These details conclude Student Affairs minutes. Student Affairs all agree that the strategies for improving electronic student communication developed by Computer services are exceptional, and voted yes 4-0.

Emily had a meeting with Tom Grites to discuss the idea of creating a blackboard courses for majors. With the creation of blackboard courses for majors students would be able to access academic information from other student, professors, as well as looking at the resources provided on the course page. The blackboard page would be able to connect the confusion of course selection, academic difficulties, career paths, and networking opportunities in one place. The academic affairs committee believes that there is a lack of knowledge and communication between students and their academic course path and career paths. By implementing this solution the committee hopes to eliminate these problems. Emily was refereed to Linda Feeney the director of E-Learning. Linda and Emily discussed concerns and possibilities of creating blackboard courses for majors as well as discussed the benefits of online classes. Further communication with the committee and the academic affairs committee will be held to create a pilot blackboard course program for specific majors.

The committee is also doing research to promote the minors that are available to Stockton students. The committee has noticed there are a number of minors that are unpopular with the student body. To encourage the addition of minors the committee is working on creating a list of minors to prompt with specific correlating majors. The committee believes by the creation of this list we would be able to increase the interest in minors. By publicizing the benefits adding a minor to incoming freshmen they will be able to consider the option of a minor early on in their education. Further meetings will be held with academic advising to research the minors available to students.

The academic affairs committee also hopes to promote the use of the student senate office for homework and study sessions to all students. The committee plans to work with the public relations committee to promote the use of the office as an area to study in hopes that the students will take advantage of the space as an invitation to get to know their senators in a studious environment.

To create a greater transparency with the graduate students at Stockton Stephanie made a suggestion box for the graduate student's lounge. From this gesture the committee hopes to gain feedback, and concerns from the graduates students.
