# High Impact Practices (HIPs)

- High Impact Practice (HIPs) are “teaching and learning practices that have been widely tested and have been shown to be beneficial for college students from many backgrounds” (AAC&U, 2013).
- HIPs Model: Educate, Engage, Achieve

## HIPs can include the following:

- 88% - Internships
- 72% - Study Abroad
- 58% - Service Learning
- 28% - Undergraduate Research
- 21% - Civic Engagement

- Increased Diversity in Recipient Pool

  - Fall 2016-2018: 1 Black/African American, 3 Hispanic/Latinx, 1 Multi-Racial, 23 Whites, 4 Asians
