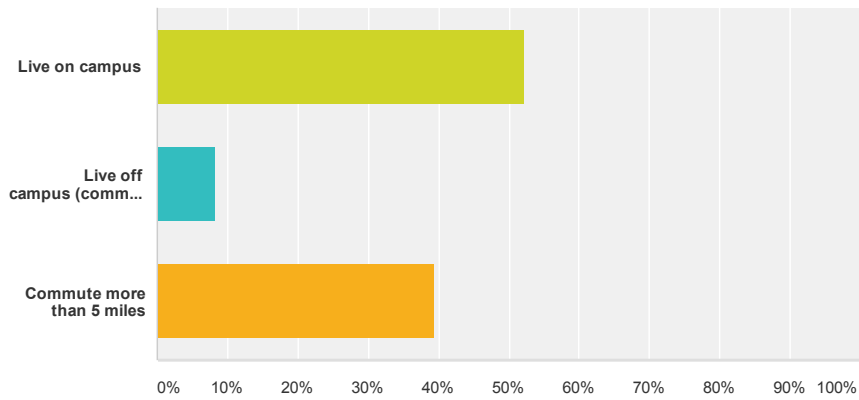

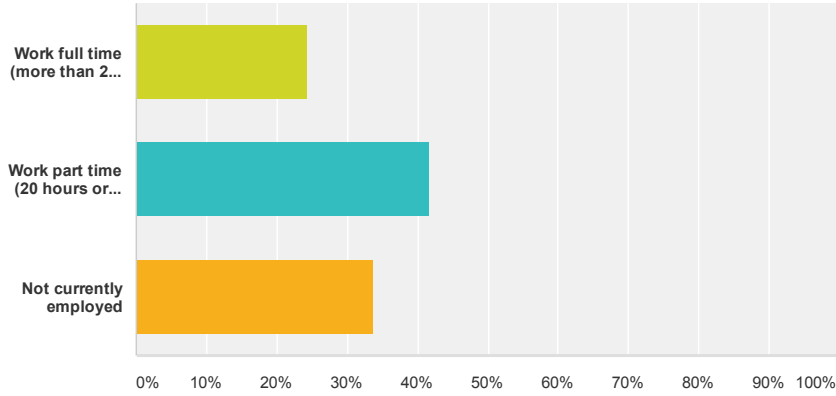

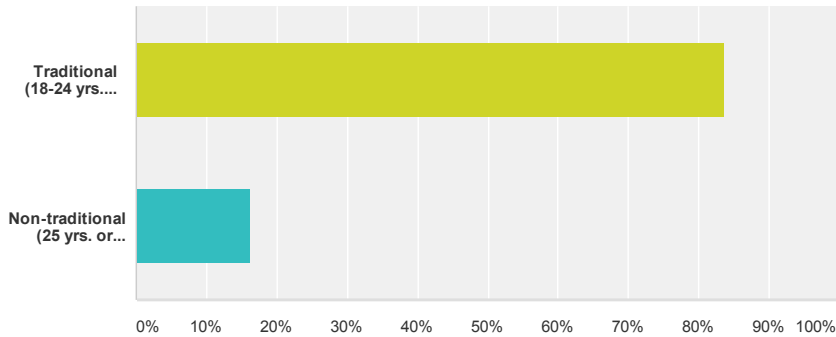

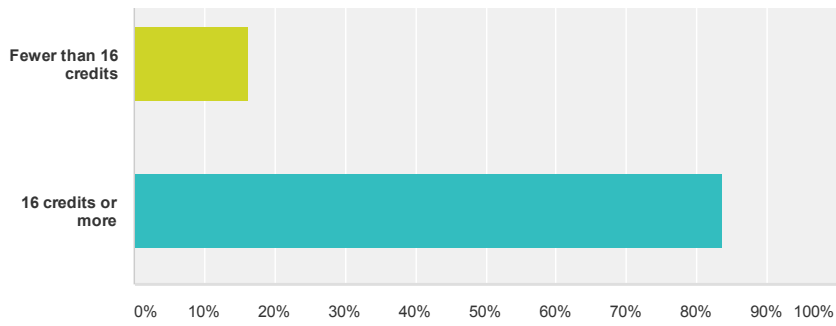

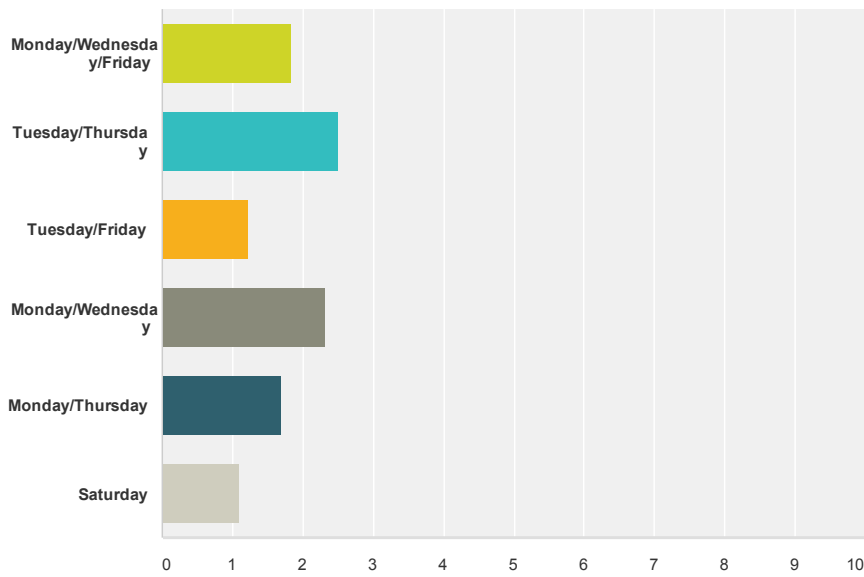

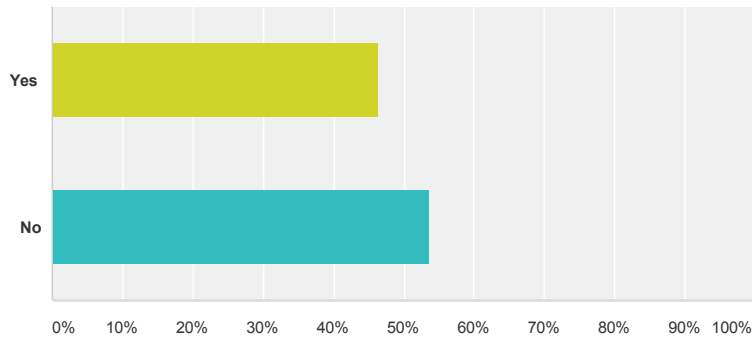

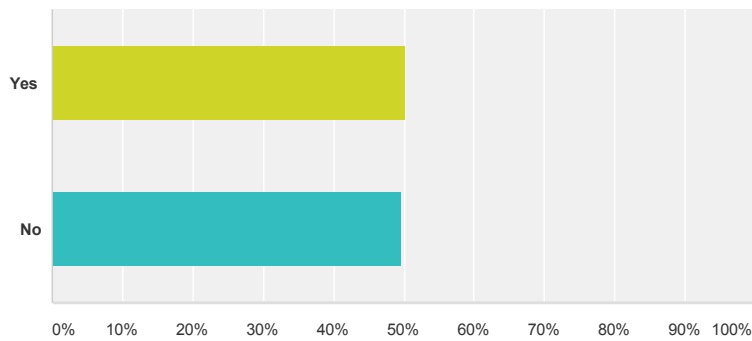

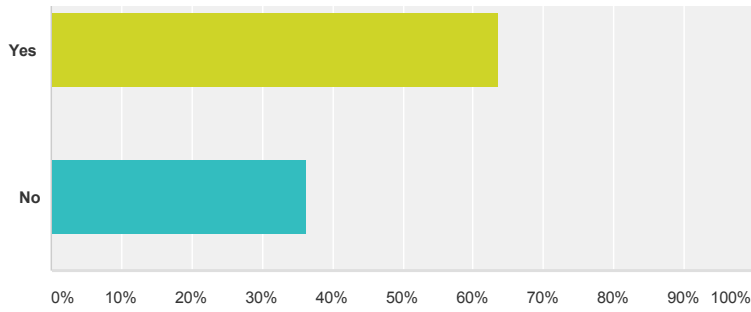

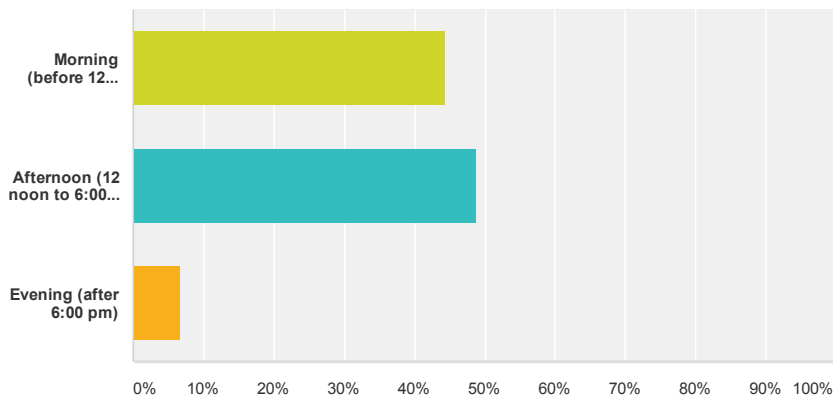

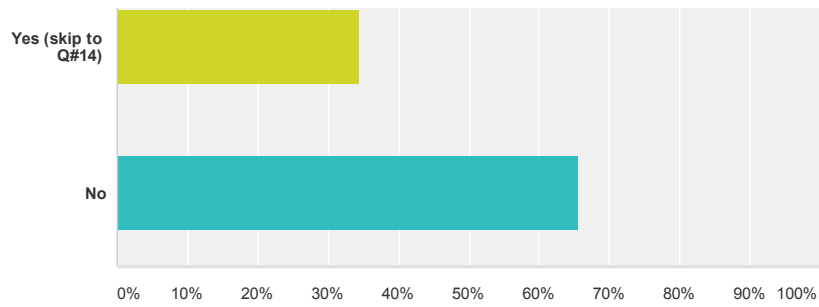

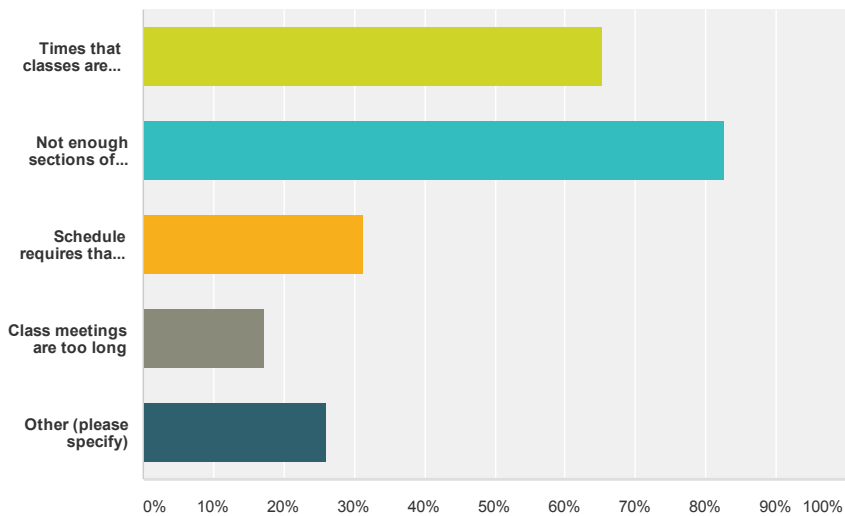

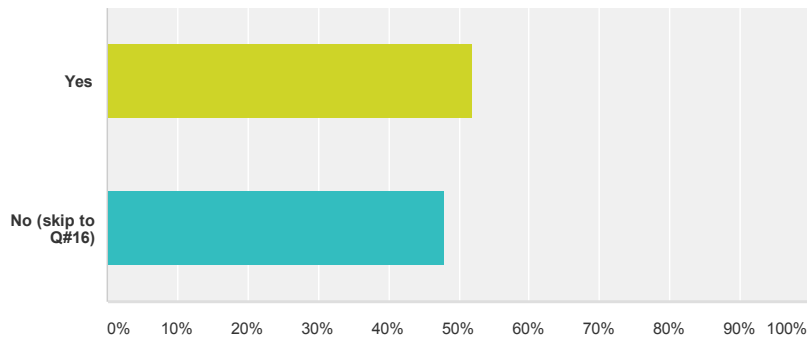

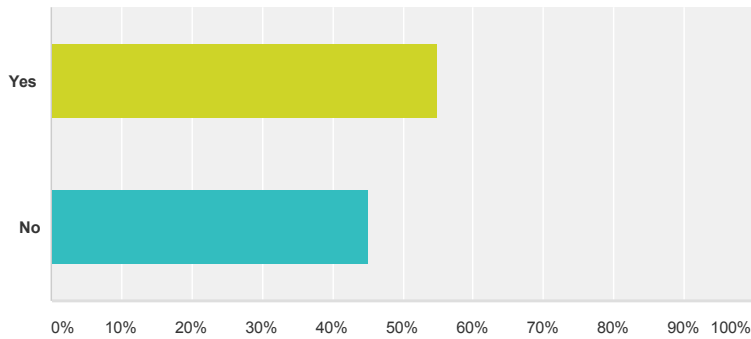

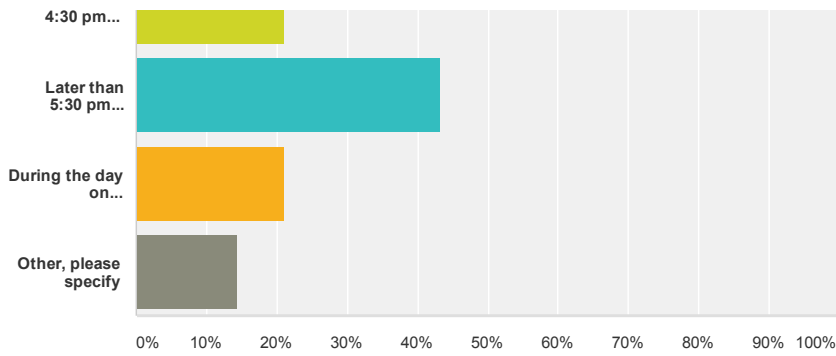

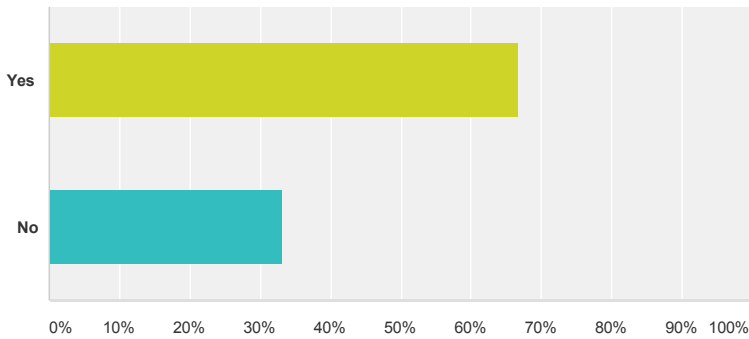

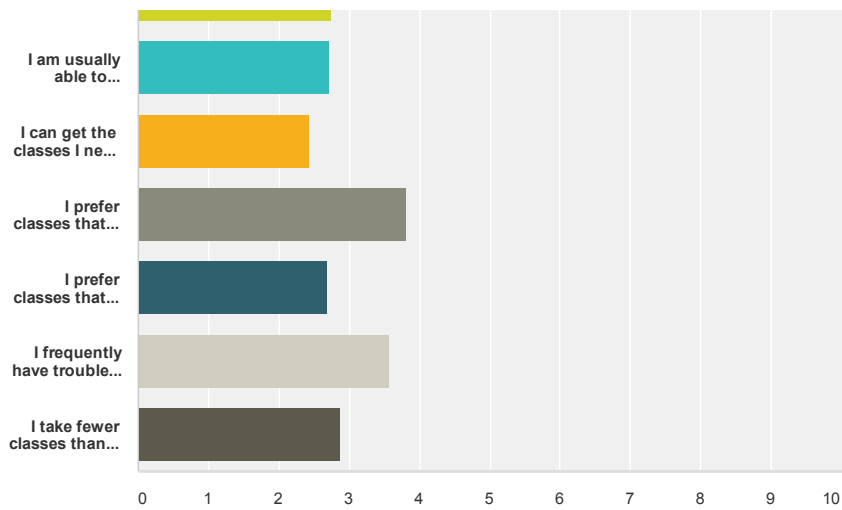

I think the G-course system is horrible. While I do believe that it is very important for students to get a broad liberal arts education as well as particular knowledge in their chosen major, I think the G course system is ineffective in achieving this goal because many of the classes offered under the G course headings are actually taught just the same as the particular professor's usual department courses are taught (G courses taught by POLS professors are taught like POLS courses, which there are not enough of offered each semester to begin with, but because all students take G courses, they are usually taught down to the level of the slowest and least interested students and not to the level of the students who are actually interested in the subject matter. Also, classes that are required for large majors like POLS are offered in only one inconvenient section each semester. Also, some professors teach only on certain days every semester and therefore students who commute and need to take all of their courses on Tuesdays and Thursdays never get to take many courses they are interested in because they are only offered on Mondays and Wednesdays. I think all courses should be offered in at least two sections every semester, one on Tuesdays/Thursdays and one on Mondays/Wednesdays. The biggest problem I have is that there is an abundance of courses offered only at 10:30 or 12:30 and practically nothing in my major offered at other times, which makes it very difficult to maintain full time status and to complete my degree. I realize that these times are part of the peak time for classes, but there are rarely any courses for a POLS student to take at 2:30. Courses should also be offered at 4:30. Currently, I have to wait from 2:30 until 6:00 to take a course I can actually use for my degree because I live almost two hours away. Stockton has a large commuter student population and should be more aware of the problems it creates for these students through the current class module system.
