**SUMMARY STATEMENTS**

- The College's enrollment management program for the Fall 1995 semester has yielded the most academically qualified freshman and transfer classes in its history.
- Academic qualifications as measured by the SAT, academic index, and grade-point average have improved for the ninth consecutive year.
- This year's Total SAT score of **1059** for regularly admitted students represents a 5 point increase when compared to last year. High school rank has remained steady at the **80th** percentile. The academic index is an impressive **221.9**.
- The College has experienced enrollment growth as evidenced by a 3% increase in the number of students enrolled (HDCT), and a 4% increase in full time equivalents (FTE).
- Ninety-one percent (91%) of our undergraduate population is matriculated, and this represents the largest proportion of matriculated students in the College's history.
- The Division of Natural Sciences and Mathematics continues to demonstrate growth in its proportional share of declared and intended majors.
- A decline in the proportion of business students continues to impact the number of majors in Professional Studies.

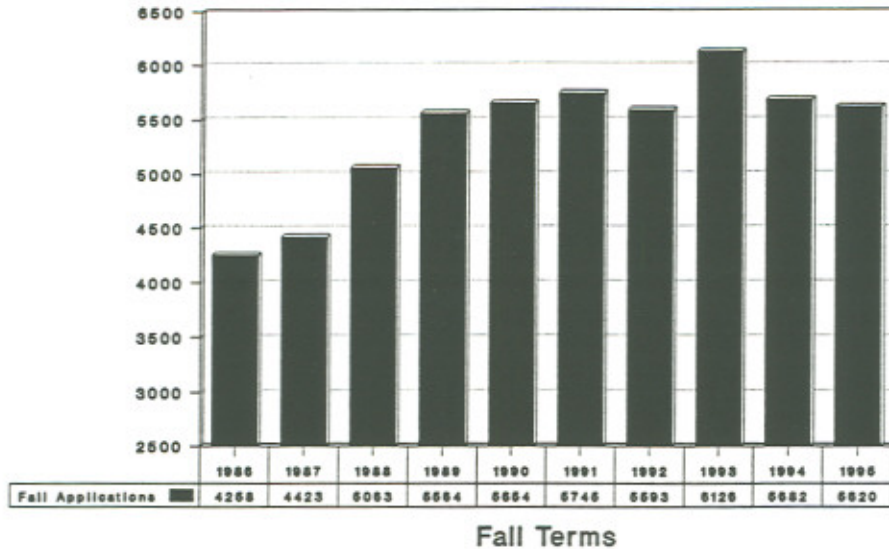

Total Applicants**

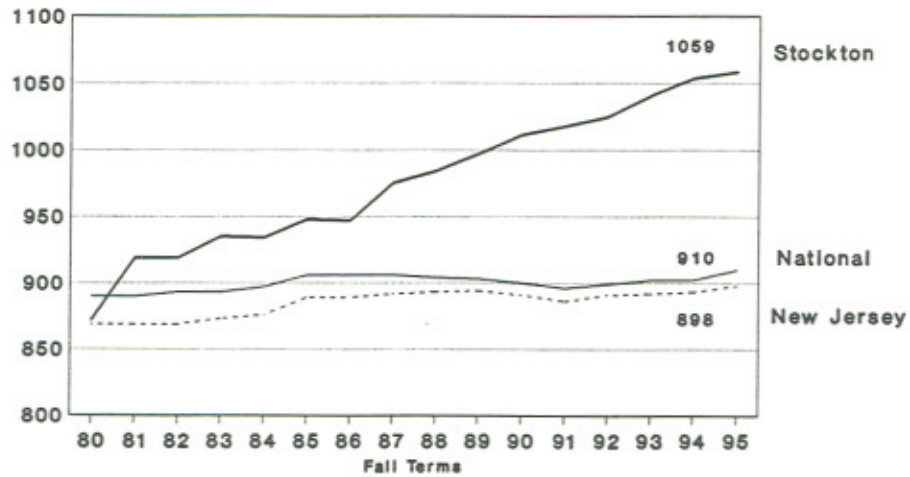


Fall Terms

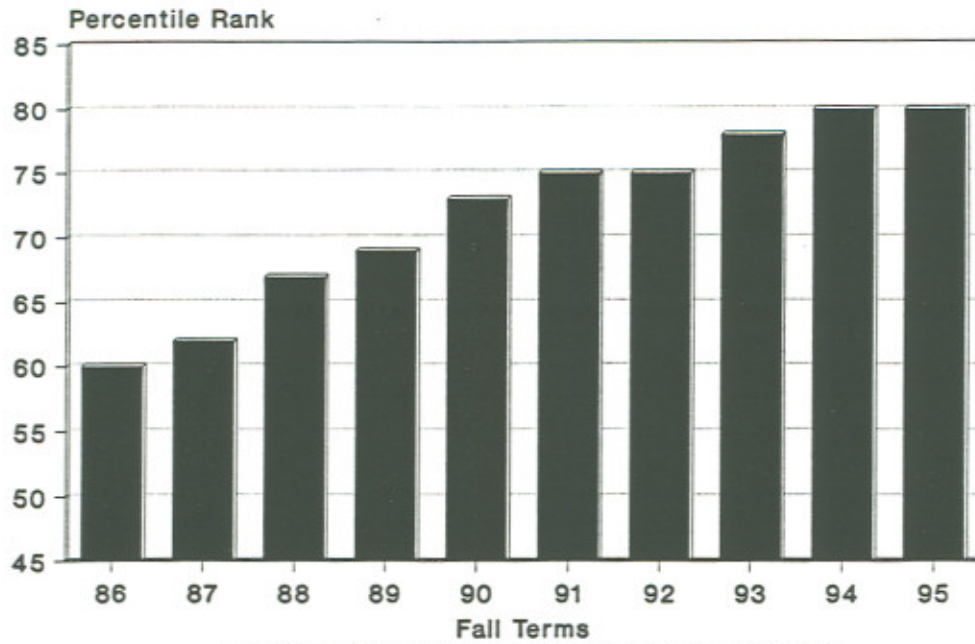
**Average Total SAT Scores 1980 - 1995

Stockton College reports a 1059 average total SAT score for its regularly admitted freshmen for the Fall 1995 semester. This figure represents a 187 point increase when compared to the Fall 1980 SAT score of 872. As a frame of reference, Stockton's improved SAT profile is significant when compared to the trends that have occurred for college-bound seniors both nationally and statewide.

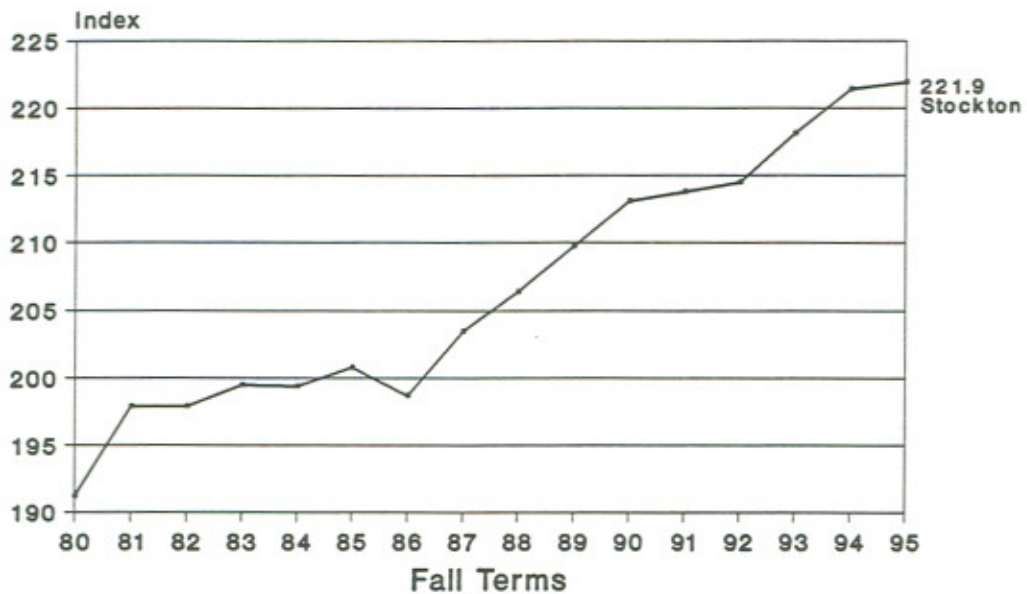
### Stockton College of New Jersey Average High School Rank 1986-1995

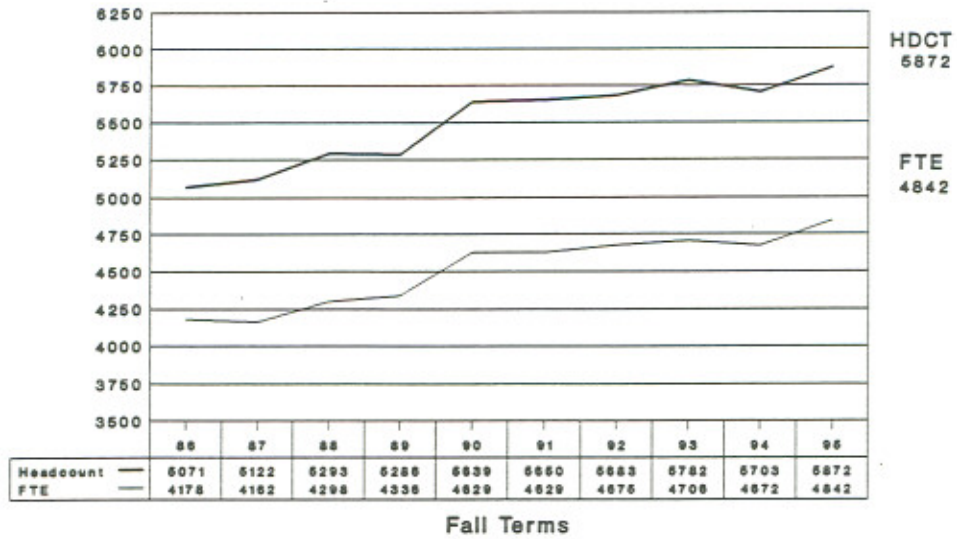
### Stockton College of New Jersey Academic Index 1980 - 1995

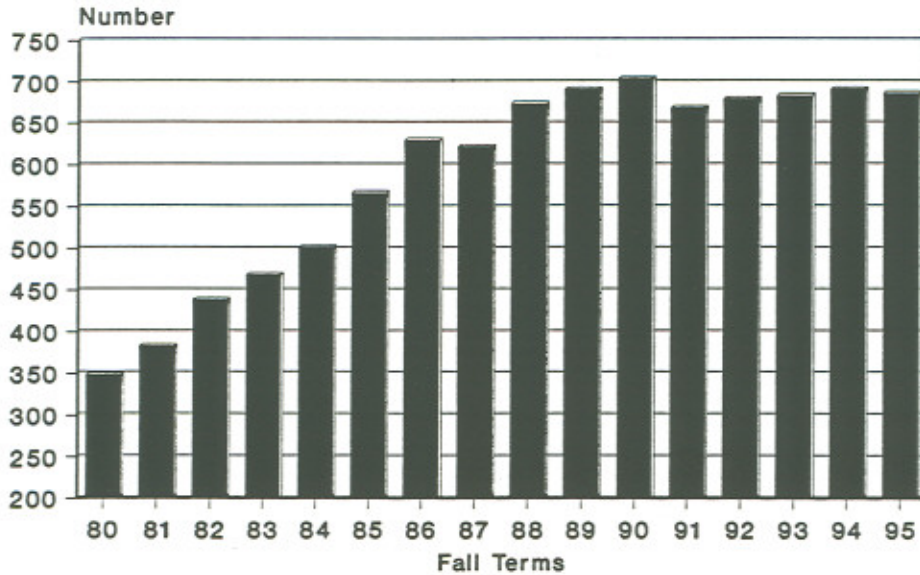
**Stockton College of New Jersey
