SUMMARY STATEMENTS

- The College's enrollment management program has yielded freshman and transfer classes with solid academic and cocurricular credentials.
- Academic qualifications as measured by the SAT, high school rank, academic index, and grade-point averages remain impressive.
- The College has experienced enrollment growth as evidenced by a 2% increase in the number of students enrolled, and a 2% increase in full time equivalents.
- Approximately 80% of the students are enrolled full-time, and the average number of credits per student is a record 13.2.
- Ninety-two percent (92%) of our population is matriculated, and this represents the largest proportion of matriculated students in our history.
- The proportional share of declared and intended majors remains relatively stable when compared to last year.
- A record 1153 students graduated during Fiscal Year 1996. This figure represents a 1% increase when compared to last year, and 9% greater than Fiscal Year 1994.
