SUMMARY STATEMENTS

- The College's enrollment management program continues to yield freshman and transfer classes with impressive academic credentials.
- Combined SAT scores for regularly admitted freshmen reached 1136, five points higher than last year's record.
- Standards for entering transfer students have remained high. The average GPA for regularly admitted transfer students is 3.1.
- The first fall class of graduate students numbers 165, with a corresponding full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment of 70.
- Undergraduate enrollment growth continues with a 1% increase in headcount, and a 2% increase in FTE, resulting in new college records of 6038 headcount, and 5011 FTE.
- More stringent entrance guidelines have resulted in a record ratio of matriculated to non-matriculated students. Currently, 93% of the undergraduate population are matriculated.
- Seventy-eight percent (78%) of undergraduate students are full-time. The average credit load per student is a record 13.3 credits.
- Both the divisions of Arts and Humanities and Social and Behavioral Sciences have experienced increases in declared and intended majors.
- A record 1217 students graduated during Fiscal Year 1997. This figure represents a 6% increase when compared to that of Fiscal Year 1996.
